SUPPLY LIST

- 5.5" x 8.5," 7" x 7" or 7" x 10" Watercolor Sketchbook (I recommend Stillman & Birn Beta Sketchbook, 5.5" x 8.5")
- Ruler
- Mechanical Pencil OR a No. 2 pencil and sharpener
- **Tracing paper
- White Eraser or Kneaded Eraser
- **Uni-Ball Signo White Gel Pen
- Large waterbrush* OR a round watercolor brush, Size 7 or 8
- Facial Tissues
- Small Watercolor Set - Please be sure paint is out and open on a palette so it is ready to go when you are.
- **This project relies on tracing paper and the Uni-Ball Signo white gel ink pen for finishing touches.
- Optional Supplies
Faber-Castell Artist PITT Pen in Phthalo Blue

Supplies I Will Be Using

- This project uses many different colors across the paintbox. There is also room for changing things up to make the glasses red or yellow or green, if the artist chooses. Details were added with a Uni-Ball Signo White Gel Pen. The lettering was added with the Faber-Castell Artist PITT Pen in Phthalo Blue.

Other Pen Recommendations:

- Faber Castell® Pitt® Pens, Pigma® Micron® and Prismacolor all make a wide range of permanent colored markers. Be very careful of using colored Sharpie® markers as they can bleed through your paper months after you use them. Tombow pens can also be used but are not permanent. Be sure you purchase a water-based Sharpie paint marker rather than the oil-based.
